

RESOLUTION NO. 418A RESOLUTION DEFINING RESPONSIBLE BIDDER
OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF SENECA

WHEREAS, in many instance and circumstances the Village of Seneca is required to let contracts to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, and,

WHEREAS, the Village has not heretofore defined the term "responsible bidder",

NOW, THEREFOR, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village of Seneca as follows:

That the term "responsible bidder" for construction related contracts entered into by the Village of Seneca means a bidder who meets all the following applicable criteria, and submits evidence of such compliance:


1. All applicable laws pre-requisite to doing business in Illinois
2. Evidence of compliance with:
 - a. Federal employer tax identification number or social security number (for individuals).
 - b. Provisions of Section 2000(e) of Chapter 21, Title 42 of the United States Code and Federal Executive Order No. 11246 as amended by Executive Order No. 11375 (known as the Equal Opportunity provisions).
3. Certificate of insurance indicating the following coverage's: general liability, worker's compensation, completed operations, automobile, hazardous occupation, product liability, and professional liability.
4. Compliance with all provisions of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act.
5. One or more of the following:
 - a. Participation in apprenticeship and training program approves and registered with the United States Department of Labor's Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training;
 - b. Licensed by the State of Illinois for the trade for which the bid is submitted;
 - c. Pre-certified as qualified by the Illinois Department of Transportation or other state office for the trade for which the bid is submitted;
 - d. Finding by the Village that the bidder is a "responsible bidder".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing herein shall be construed to affect any suit

or proceeding now pending in any court or any rights accrued or liability incurred or cause or causes of action accrued or existing under any prior Resolution or Ordinance. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired, or affected by this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be in full Force and effect immediately upon its adoption and publication in pamphlet form
